Text by Saint Ambrose (340-397)

Illuminare is Elaine's first extended work, consisting of five-movements for SATB chorus and chamber orchestra. Using lesser-known sacred Latin texts, the piece takes us through a season of beauty and goodness that has been disrupted by darkness and confusion. But as Light gradually returns, hope is restored, illuminating our future and guiding us in peace. With a majestic and bright opening in D major, Illuminare begins with a radiant flurry of 16th notes representing the entrance of Light. Then the voices enter in powerful unison, and the Ambrosian hymn text bursts into a punctuated and joyful "Gloriae" section. As the music turns to a softer legato passage, a portion of the peace theme is revealed in the cello—a theme that will emerge several times throughout the work. The music then returns to the joyful rhythmic momentum of the beginning.

Mass

Text of the Mass Ordinary

Igor Stravinsky dominated the performing arts throughout the twentieth century. Although his career was ignited by his collaboration with Serge Diaghilev and the Ballets Russe, Stravinsky's success emerged as his music became more complex and more varied over time. The immense terror and intensity conveyed by *The Rite of Spring* (1913) codified Stravinsky's compositional legacy of rhythm, meter, and tone color. Soon, his need for structure and clarity would inform his *Pulcinella* (1920) marking the beginning of his Neoclassical era. The *Mass* (1944) is his only mass setting, an austere liturgical work for the Catholic rite as Orthodox tradition forbids the use of musical instruments. This work is highly anachronistic as Stravinsky recalls musical elements from centuries before: plainsong, fauxbourdon, troping, and antiphony. Completed in 1948 for mixed chorus and double wind quintet, the *Mass* uses similar winds and brass as in *Symphony of Psalms* (1930). This piece also foreshadows his last composition era where he championed serialism evident in his final work *Requiem Canticles* (1966).
