

To Strong Auditorium, the concert home of the University of Rochester Orchestras. Our program this evening explores a Finnish National tone poem, a small scale Spanish symphony via Mexico, and some explosive talent from right here on campus, first written for a father and son concert team.

Jean Sibelius wrote Finlandia originally as part of a political protest. Composed in honor of the Finnish Press Pension Gala in 1899, it supported what has been called by author Betsy Schwarm a "thinly veiled rally in support of freedom of the Finnish press, then largely controlled by tsarist Russia." The work's worldwide popularity since its premiere, in kind with current conditions, makes our presentation of the work particularly significant this evening.

Like many active composers whose lives spanned the bulk of the 20th century, ofttimes their popularity inexplicably dies with them. This is particularly the case in the music of María Teresa Prieto, a Spanish composer who spent a great deal of time in Mexico. The lyricism of the work is present throughout, as is a puckish sense of humour, and a willingness to exploit ensemble minutia for some exquisite details and effects. We are pleased to make the New York premiere of this work tonight.

We conclude our concert with UR Concerto Winner, April Wang, and her performance of the second piano concerto by Dmitri Shostakovich. The work premiered almost exactly sixty-eight years ago with the elder Shostakovich conducting the orchestra of the Moscow Conservatory with his son Maxim, as the featured soloist. The music remains as fresh, vital, sentimentally beautiful, and playful as any of Shostakovich's works and we are delighted to be able to feature April's performance tonight along with the exceptional student, faculty, staff, and UR community members that make up this extraordinary ensemble.
